# Environmental impact assessment (EIA)

## What is an Environmental Impact Assessment

The purpose of an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) is to protect the environment and the quality of life by ensuring that projects which are likely to have significant environmental effects by virtue of their nature, size or location are subject to an environmental impact assessment before permission is granted. This applies to marine licences, harbour orders and many other types of consent, permission or authorisation.

MMO is the appropriate authority for ensuring the requirements of EIA are met in relation to marine licences, harbour orders and other consents. To meet the requirements MMO must assess the effect that projects may have on the environment and the quality of life where it is likely they will have significant effects. This is called an environmental impact assessment. This assessment must be undertaken before consent can be given for a project. It begins with the customer gathering and assessing information about the likely effects of the project and presenting this in the form of an environmental statement to support their consent application. This will then be considered in determining whether or not consent should be given for the project.

An EIA is a multi-stage process. The main steps are:

- 1. Screening The applicant provides information and MMO determines whether an EIA is required.
- 2. Scoping The applicant provides information and MMO advises on the impacts that are to be considered during the EIA.
- 3. The applicant prepares the environmental statement.
- 4. The applicant may submit a draft ES for review and comment by MMO
- 5. The applicant submits the ES as part of an application and this is considered by MMO, consultees and the public before a decision is made.

## **Project background**

PD Teesport (PDT) applied for a Harbour Revision Order (HRO) for the proposed Northern Gateway Container Terminal (NGCT) under Section 14 of the Harbours Act 1964 in 2006. An application for planning permission under the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 was also submitted to Redcar and Cleveland Borough Council (RCBC) at the same time. In support of these applications, Royal Haskoning carried out an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) and produced the NGCT Environmental Statement (ES) in 2006 (Royal Haskoning, 2006) (referred to as the 2006 ES). The Teesport Harbour Revision Order (HRO) (referred to as the 2008 HRO) was subsequently made on 18th April 2008, coming into force on 8th May 2008. The HRO is due to expire on 8th May 2018. Planning permission was granted by RCBC in 2007.

The marine elements of the NGCT have not yet been implemented, however the landside elements of the proposed scheme have commenced (and therefore the planning permission granted by RCBC has been implemented). PDT is proposing to extend the expiry date of the 2008 HRO for 15 years until 8th May 2033.

PDT intends to apply to the Marine Management Organisation (MMO) for a time extension to the 2008 HRO only at this stage as opposed to simultaneously applying for a marine licence (i.e. no application will be made for construction works at the present time).

The purpose of this request is to seek an EIA screening opinion from the MMO under Regulation 11(4) the 2007 Regulations as well as requesting a 15 year extension to the 2008 HRO.

In addition to the provision of an EIA Screening Opinion under the 2007 Regulations, we are also seeking confirmation from the MMO that the proposed scope of environmental assessment to support the application to extend the 2008 HRO is appropriate.

The proposed scheme is defined in full within Section 3 of the 2006 ES (which is attached to this application). In summary, the proposed scheme comprises:

•Capital dredging of the approach channel to the proposed NGCT (equating to approximately 4.8 million m3 of material).

•Disposal of dredged material (through a combination of beneficial reuse (localised reclamation and raising land levels within the proposed terminal site) and offshore disposal of dredged material).

•Construction of a container terminal facility.

•Construction of various landside elements (buildings, rail terminal, road access, lighting, drainage and a pumping station).
